Hong Kong is a prime venue for dispute resolution through arbitration and mediation:

- Mature and well-developed legal system and large pool of experienced professionals
- Hong Kong arbitral awards enforceable in over 150 Contracting States to the New York Convention and this is complemented by reciprocal enforcement arrangements with Mainland China and Macao
- Choice of ad hoc and administered arbitration, and of arbitration institutions
- Intellectual property disputes are arbitrable
- The number of dispute resolution cases handled by the Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre (HKIAC), including both arbitration and mediation, reached 532 in 2017; the total disputed amount for the administered cases was about US\$5 billion in 2017
- HKIAC ranked first for location, value for money, helpfulness of staff and IT services by the Global Arbitration Review (GAR) Hearing Centres Surveys 2016, 2017 and 2018
- Since 2015, Hong Kong has been among the top 5 preferred seats for arbitration globally according to the International Arbitration Surveys conducted by Queen Mary University of London
- Mediation is the mechanism used to resolve investment disputes under the Mainland and Hong Kong Closer Economic Partnership Arrangement (CEPA)



Home to global institutions

The conversion of the remaining parts of the former Central Government Offices (CGO) is underway to provide a prime location for local, regional and international law-related organisations. Together with offices of the Department of Justice (DoJ) in other parts of the former CGO, the whole area will form a legal hub in the heart of Hong Kong – a poignant and physical reminder of the importance of the legal system to Hong Kong's success past, present and future.

The first 17 law-related organisations will move into new offices at the West Wing of the former CGO and the former French Mission Building, a declared monument built in 1917. Office space is expected to be available from the first quarter of 2019 at the earliest.

- The Basic Law preserves Hong Kong's common law system
- Judicial independence is constitutionally protected

"One Country, Two Legal Systems"

A Special Administrative Region with a high degree of autonomy under "one country, two systems" as implemented by the Basic Law:

- Access to justice under a common law system
- Overseas judges sitting at the apex court with power of final adjudication
- Over 250 multilateral or bilateral agreements entered into by or on behalf of "Hong Kong, China" in fields including economic, trade, financial and monetary, shipping, communications, tourism, cultural and sports

Hong Kong's strong legal infrastructure is served by:

- About 9,500 practising solicitors and over 1,400 practising barristers (including about 100 Senior Counsel)
- About 1,500 registered foreign lawyers from over 30 jurisdictions with over 80 registered foreign law firms
- Industry-led legal bodies include: the Hong Kong Bar Association; the Law Society of Hong Kong; Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre; Hong Kong Institute of Arbitrators; Hong Kong Mediation Centre; Hong Kong Mediation Accreditation Association Limited; Asian Academy of International Law; and Hong Kong Insurance Law Association Limited
